WEEKLY SNAPSHOT

Nov 28th - Dec 7th 2020



- House fire reported on Blaine Avenue at 2:38 am Wednesday. Two people living upstairs got out safely, but Rosemount Firefighters located a third male living in the basement was unresponsive and not breathing. CPR was performed and the male was taken to the hospital. The male's current medical condition is unknown.



- Accident at the corner of County Road 42 and Chippendale after a car turning left on a flashing yellow arrow failed to yield and hit an oncoming vehicle. The vehicle then ran into a light pole on the corner of the intersection. Both vehicles were towed, and the driver of the second vehicle was taken to the hospital with minor injuries.
- A dishwasher was reported stolen from a new home construction site, and the suspects did not turn the water off after stealing the dishwasher. Leaking water caused considerable damage to the kitchen area and finished basement below. No suspect information is known.
- A female suspect, described as a heavy-set black female, attempted to shoplift at the Rosemount Liquor Store and left the store with several bottles of alcohol. The employees attempted to stop the female and began a tug-of-war with the stolen bottles. Some bottles were broken/smashed during the event while others were recovered. The female suspect jumped into a waiting vehicle and got away. Apparently, this is not the first time this female suspect has tried to steal from the store.

- At approximately 8:45 pm one evening, officers responded to a suspicion call in the area of Connemara Trail and Shannon Parkway. The call notes mentioned that the reporting party was calling to report that a female police officer was being held hostage at an unknown location in Rosemount. The caller, a 39-year-old male, told dispatch that someone stole 100 million dollars worth of gold bars from him. He stated that when he went to retrieve his money, he saw that a police officer was being held hostage inside. The male also mentioned someone was holding a gun. As officers responded they were updated that the male was now in the lobby of the police department. They responded back to speak with him. The male was agitated and uncooperative; he was eventually arrested for Gross Misdemeanor license violations.
